FANTOCHE 2025: WORK, WORK, WORK

The programme for this year's Fantoche, which takes place from 2 – 7 September 2025 in Baden, features more than 250 short films and feature films. In its 23rd outing, the International Animation Film Festival is dedicated to animation from Estonia and, in the focus programme '9 to 5', questions the meaning of work. The six days of the festival offer numerous opportunities to meet international and national artists, to gain unique insights into their work and to discover current feature films from all over the world and the latest multimedia trends. The heart of Fantoche is its International, Swiss and Kids Film Competitions, with the prize ceremony taking place at TRAFO in Baden from 6 pm onwards on 7 September.

'9 to 5'

Inspired by Dolly Parton's classic, the festival's focus programme '9 to 5' is dedicated to the theme of work. Curated by Olga Bobrowska, the short film and feature film programme critically explores patriarchal and capitalist structures. In the South Korean feature film 'Chun Tae-II', trade unionist Jeon Tae-il goes to the extreme in the fight for labour rights. 'Piercing I' depicts the lives of two unemployed people in Beijing and is both a story about friendship and a crime film. The short film programme 'We are the World, we are the Assets' is dedicated to working people, who are reduced to mere resources in the global work system. The programme 'Even a Girl could do it: Stories of Labor, Life, and Survival' shows short films from a feminist perspective. These stories are about difficult working conditions, exploitation, creative resistance and the quest for self-determination.

The exhibition 'Urban Sketchers @ Work' at the Gluri Suter Huus depicts the development of Wettingen as a place of work. The four additional short films in the 'Working Class Hero' programme, curated by Fantoche, show the reality of a working day geared towards efficiency. In the 'Resisting Grind Culture' talk, animation is analysed as a tool of resistance against patriarchal and capitalist work structures.

The annual collaboration between Fantoche and the Zurich University of the Arts Department of Design also examines the focus theme: the group exhibition 'REFRESH x Fantoche # 4' presents games, videos and interactive installations on work in the post-digital age. In the '24/7 – Work, Work, Work' talk, participants discuss how algorithms are changing the world of work.

Focus on Estonia

The second focus is on animated filmmaking in Estonia. Like Switzerland, Estonia proves that artistic excellence and well-thought-out funding structures can enhance animation's global appeal. Filmmaker Helen Unt and art professor Lilli-Krōōt Repnau (Estonian Academy of Arts) have curated three short film programmes laden with symbolic power, surreal images, contemporary aesthetics and existential themes.

In the programme 'Male+ Voices from Estonia', Estonian filmmakers and a female director explore serious themes in an artful and playful way. 'Female+ Voices from Estonia' brings together promising film debuts and modern fairy tales – important places of refuge in these times of war. 'EKA Focus' shows award-winning current films by students of the Animation Master's programme at the Estonian Academy of Arts (EKA).

A talk with the curators and filmmakers as well as an Artist Talk on Industry Day with award-winning filmmaker Sander Joon ('Sierra') will also shine the spotlight on the Estonian animated film scene.

Recent feature films

Fantoche is showing 16 recent feature films for young and old animation fans this year. The festival will open with 'Amélie aet la metaphysique des tubes' (FR 2025) by Liane-Cho Han Jin Kuang and Maïlys Vallade. The two directors turn Amélie Nothomb's autobiographical novel into a visually powerful film experience: Amélie grows up in Japan and, as a two-year-old Belgian girl, begins to discover her place in the world. Childhood biographies are a recurring theme throughout this year's programme. In 'Hola Frida' (CA/FR 2024), Karine Vézina and André Kadi portray the future Mexican artist Frida Kahlo, while in the Swiss co-production 'Mary Anning' (CH/BE 2025), Ticino director Marcel Barelli shines the spotlight on the early years of the first recognised female palaeontologist.

French director Léonard Cohen's 'Le Parfum d'Irak' (FR/BE 2024) is a sensitive family story and at the same time a haunting animated documentary about the recent events in Iraq. The feature debut of Emma Hough Hobbs and Leela Varghese, 'Lesbian Space Princess' (AU 2024), is lively and amusing, yet profound – the two directors received a Teddy Award at the Berlinale for their queer sci-fi comedy. The Canadian film 'La mort n'existe pas' (CA/FR 2025) by Félix Dufour-Laperrière about assassin Hélène is aesthetically outstanding. Anime fans won't want to miss 'ChaO' (JP 2025) – a heart-warming love story between a fish princess and the office employee Stephan. With 'Memoir of a Snail' (AU 2024), director Adam Elliott has once again succeeded in creating a heart-rending tragicomedy with quirky characters and biting humour following 'Mary and Max'. 'Night of the Zoopocalypse' (CA/BE/FR 2024), a horror parody set in a zoo, also delivers sharp humour.

Like 'Mary Anning' and 'Hola Frida', 'Tales from the Magic Garden' (CZ/SK/SI/FR 2025) is a film for the whole family. The stop-motion film takes a subtle and witty look at the subject of transience. Another family highlight (from age 10) is 'Arco' (FR 2025). The film tells the story of a boy from the future who travels as a rainbow into the past and turns the life of Iris, a girl of the same age, upside down. The science fiction utopia of comic author Ugo Bienvenu was named best film at the renowned animation film festival Annecy this year. 'Olivia and the Invisible Earthquake' (ES/FR/BE/CL/CH 2025), a Swiss co-production, tells the story of a girl whose life changes dramatically overnight.

For kids & families & the next generation

There's more 'For Kids and Teens' besides the current feature films for the whole family. In 'Kids for Kids', talented young artists up to the age of 12 present their animated works on the big screen, while in 'Toons by Teens' newcomers up to the age of 17 put their skills to the test. On Wednesday afternoon and the weekend, the popular Walk-in Workshop will again take place in the Merker Areal, where children and teenagers can create their own animated film. There are recent short films to discover in the Children's Film Competition and 'Panorama Next Gen.' In 'Next Gen Ani', the next animation generation will be given tips by professionals.

Competition

In 2025, the Fantoche selection team chose 89 animated short films out of a total of 3050 submissions. Of these, 23 will be screened in the 'Panorama' programmes, while 66 will compete in the International Competition, the Swiss Competition and the Children's Film Competition. Fantoche is now one of the Oscar qualifying festivals, which means that films from the International Competition can qualify for participation in the Academy Awards®. Fantoche is also recognised as a BAFTA qualifying festival.

11th Fantoche Industry Day

'Think Outside the Frame' – disrupting familiar formats and thinking bigger about animation – is the motto of the 11th Industry Day, which takes place this year on Thursday, 4 September. The focus is on international co-productions, storytelling and pitching, and the question of how personal style can be incorporated into commercial projects. One highlight is the visit by Simon Magnan. He offers insights into his work as Environment 3 D Supervisor at Fortiche – the French animation studio behind the successful series 'Arcane'. Industry Day concludes with the presentation of the Swiss Animation Industry Award. In collaboration with the SWISSFILM Association, Fantoche is presenting the award for the best animated commissioned film in Switzerland for the eighth time.

Plus...

Three 'Making-of' sessions this year offer exclusive insights. In his feature film 'Le Parfum d'Irak', director Léonard Cohen shows how animation and documentary intertwine and demonstrates the perfect transition from information to emotion. Australian directors Emma Hough Hobbs and Leela Varghese talk about their feature debut 'Lesbian Space Princess' – a lively homage to queer life with great cult potential. Game director Onat Hekimoglu presents 'Harold Halibut' – an award-winning stop-motion game about a spaceship caretaker.

Three animators will attend the festival for a 'Meet the Artist' event. Nina Gantz, who is also part of the competition jury, combines stop-motion, puppetry and live action and has won BAFTA awards and an Oscar nomination for her films. Lucija Mrzljak, also a jury member and Oscar-nominated animation filmmaker, is regarded as a subversive and important representative of Estonian animated film. David Szauder explores the creative interplay between art and AI.

The 'Retrospective' is dedicated to Bolivian-Swiss animator Jesús Pérez. He taught himself animation autodidactically and developed a lively, visually poetic style of animation. As a long-standing lecturer at Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts, Pérez helped to shape countless animation students.

Austrian cartoonist Nicolas Mahler and his Lucerne co-director Stefan Holaus will be celebrating a world premiere at Fantoche, as they will be showing all 26 episodes of their 'One Minute Movies' in one go for the first time. Renowned puppet animator Kihachirō Kawamoto, who would have turned 100 this year, will receive a special tribute when Fantoche presents his magnum opus 'The Book of the Dead'.

The new programme highlight, the 'Midnight Snack', serves up quirky short films at the end the day: cat fans get their money's worth ('If You Love Cats, This is For You') and puppets teach us all about the art of fear ('As if They Were Breathing – Uncanny Puppets in Motion'). Sketches, figures and other objects from the competition films can also be viewed in the 'Animation Artefacts' exhibition at Kunstraum Baden.

The annual festival fixtures include the Artists' Brunch, the Bagno Popolare, church on Sunday, the Fantoche restaurant & bar and the varied programme at the Royal, which ranges from an immersive concert to a VJ battle to parties.
