BEST FILM

This Is a Story Without a Plan Cassie Shao, US 2023

Two characters are witnessing a constant explosion in different fragments of their lives. A tale of observers.

The film takes us on a joyful and free-spirited whirlwind, where everything comes together harmoniously: the vibrant aesthetics and the narrative madness, all of which showcases the director's singular vision. HIGH RISK

HIC SVNT DRACONES Justin Fayard, FR 2024

Only yesterday, dragons were coming down to see what humans were doing in their valleys. Destroying everything in their path, we cursed them, in vain.

Jury-Laudatio: «The parsimonious use of animation, far from frenzy, takes the time of contemplation. With an incredible work on the sound and very slow movements, the film reveals the majestic strength but also the fragility of the world around us. To be so demanding with an audience is not so easy in our society where everything needs to go fast. The **High Risk** award goes to **HIC SVNT DRACONES** by Justin Fayard.»

NEW TALENT

Tabac froid Arthur Jamain, FR 2023

Can we tell our mother that we have been sexually assaulted by our brother? The obvious answer should be "yes". However, only few dare to break the silence. The question we ask ourselves is: "Why aren't we talking about it?"

Jury-Laudatio: «The film tackles a challenging subject with a minimalist yet powerful approach, offering a raw and relatable portrayal of contemporary relationships. Its refined cinematography and precise animation performance are strikingly sophisticated for a new artist. In a programme filled with abstract and highly animated films, its understated acting and respect for the subject matter truly stand out. We are pleased to present the **New Talent** award to **Tabac froid** by Arthur Jamain.»

BEST VISUAL

Pear Garden Shadab Shayegan, DE 2024

Six-year-old Lily visits her grandmother, who has had a mastectomy and now misses her breasts. When Lily finds out that her grandmother's shadow still has both breasts, she is prepared to do anything to get them back.

Jury-Laudatio: "This film's expressionistic style makes its story accessible to all audiences, regardless of their familiarity with arthouse animation. The visual design, with its vibrant color palette and crayon-like texture that resembles childhood drawings, transcends age and artistic preferences, allowing viewers to connect with the beautifully crafted narrative. SPECIAL MENTION INTERNATIONAL JURY

Dreams About Putin Vlad Fishez, Nastia Korkia, PT/BE/ HU 2023

Since the Russian invasion of Ukraine, many Russians have shared dreams about their president on social media. A selection of these posts has been brought to life in this film. The result is a bizarre and disturbing nightmare vision that explores the theme of the collective unconscious in Russian society.

Jury-Laudatio: «We initially believe we're stepping into a video game, only to realize that we're navigating different dreams haunted by the same ominous figure. As the film unfolds, a growing sense of oppression creeps in, making us feel the weight of how an entire population can be affected—even in their sleep. Blurring the lines between dream and reality, the film powerfully conveys the idea that oppression doesn't just exist in the waking world; it follows people into their dreams. This is why we wanted to give a **Special Mention** to **Dreams about Putin** by Vlad Fishez and Nastia Korkia.»

BEST SWISS

Sans voix Samuel Patthey, CH 2024

Jury-Laudatio: "This filmmaker brought the audience into their emotional journey and took us right in. Together with their strong drawing skills, musical score and fluidity in the pacing this film successfully gave us the perspective of a lost man who finds his way. It had a clear vision and statement of life as a connection of moments executed in an honest and vulnerable way. It came from the guts, and therefore **Sans voix** from Samuel Patthey gets the **Best Swiss** award."

HIGH SWISS RISK

La Perra Carla Melo Gampert, CO/CH 2023,

NEW SWISS TALENT

About a Cow Pavla Baštanová, CZ/CH 2023,

Situations and stories from the lives of cows: cows grazing in the pasture, cows bringing peace to people in a therapy garden, cows in the slaughterhouse... A patchwork of idyllic and dramatic images illustrates the connection between humans and animals in both a positive and negative light and ends by giving us hope for a better world.

Jury-Laudatio: «This film was playful and poetic with an unexpected topic. We enjoyed the sound design, the joyful approach to metamorphosis and the filmmaker's freedom in exploring the art of animation. The **New Swiss Talent** award goes to **About a Cow** by Pavla Baštanová.»

FANTASTIC SWISS

Matta and Matto Bianca Caderas, Kerstin Zemp, CH 2023, 10'16"

In a dystopian world where people are forbidden to touch one another, Matta and Matto offer a place of refuge for the lonely in their travelling hotel. In the rooms of the Hotel Vaip, the guests' find their deepest desires fulfilled and even surpassed. But this comes at a high price.

Jury-Laudatio: "This film brought us into an imagining of what the worst of life after the pandemic could be. It showed us a unique universe and was intentional in its use of color and aesthetic. We hope all those surprises and troubling ideas stay in the realm of fantasy. The **Fantastic Swiss** award goes to **Matta and Matto** by Bianca Caderas and Kerstin Zemp."

SPECIAL MENTION SWISS JURY

On Hold Delia Hess, CH 2024

A young woman is stuck in the queue of a telephone hotline. A surreal, episodic short film about the absurdities of urban life and the feeling of paralysing stagnation.

Jury-Laudatio: «This filmmaker successfully showed us the absurdity of today's big city life that we all can relate to. This was a great observation piece that connected seemingly unrelated things using wonderful rhythm and a great soundtrack. Therefore we'd like to give a **Special Mention** to **On Hold** by Delia Hess.»

Dieter, an ill sculptor, hasn't really been able to work for a long time. Simple tasks elude him. His thoughts frequently transport him away from his workshop into another, fantastic world, into mysterious landscapes.

SWISS YOUTH AWARD

Sans voix Samuel Patthey, CH 2024

Dan spends a lot of time in his flat. His daily life is accompanied by the electronic music pumping through his headphones. But when the young man goes outside, he feels disconnected from the world around him and only finds solace in nightclubs. One day, he catches the eye of a baby who will change his perception of the world around him.

Jury-Laudatio: «This film portrays a cycle of loneliness and, most importantly, how engrossing it can be. It may appear easy to escape this cycle through the abuse of drugs and alcohol, but through the absence of the main character's face, we understand that ultimately what he truly lacks is the ability to see a future for himself. However, the film is not without hope, as it also demonstrates that there is always a way out of the tunnel. Because of the film's message and how it's portrayed through animation, we chose Samuel Patthey's **Sans Voix** for this year's **Swiss Youth Award**.»

SWISS YOUTH AWARD SPECIAL MENTION I

The Car That Came Back From the Sea Jadwiga Kowalska, PL/CH 2023

Full of exuberance and frivolousness, six friends drive to the Polish Baltic coast and back in a small, beaten-up car. During their trip, their car and their country fall apart. Nevertheless, life goes on.

Jury-Laudatio: «This film captivated us because of the characters' points of view: they are young, naïve, and aware of the perils of their country, but they still feel the need to have fun and better their situation. The film deals with an incredibly serious topic, yet remains funny throughout. Because of the perfect balance between these two aspects, we want to give a **Special Mention** to **The Car that Came back from the Sea** by Jadwiga Kowalska.»

SWISS YOUTH AWARD SPECIAL MENTION II

La Perra Carla Melo Gampert, CO/CH 2023

Jury-Laudatio: «This film deals with a brutal topic, but does so in a very nuanced and realistic way. You can't help but feel uncomfortable when you are confronted with themes of generational trauma and the objectification of women. Most specifically, with the way that society reduces women to a category: the mother, the nanny, the bitch. The film resonated greatly with the jury, and we could not stop talking about it, which is why we believe that Carla Melo Gampert's **La Perra** also deserves a **Special Mention**.»

The children's jury is made up of six children between the ages of 8 and 12 and is supervised by the Zauberlaterne children's film club. Since 2010 the children's jury has awarded the prize for the best children's film.

Bubbles Lezhi Xiao, CN 2023

You can be lonely even when you're surrounded by people. This Chinese cartoon sensitively broaches the topic of connection from the perspective of a young girl seeking contact with her mother.

Jury-Laudatio: «Because we recognise ourselves in the main character,

Because the emotions are well portrayed in the images,

Because the story remains exciting throughout the film,

Because it shows the importance of the bond between mother and daughter,

And because we are impressed by the main character's determination to fight against negative feelings,

... the Kids Jury awards the Best Kids award to Bubbles by Lezhi Xiao.»

SPECIAL MENTION KIDS

Cave of Warmth Shamir Raiapov, KG 2023

In this Kyrgyz film, the daughter of a hunter and a young wolf are looking for their parents. When they find them, they face a difficult decision. The film poetically questions the possibility of peace against a backdrop of intergenerational conflicts.

Jury-Laudatio: «Because the beautiful way the film is drawn immediately immerses us in the story, Because the film tells a lot in a short time,

Because friendship wins despite everything,

Because it shows that history does not have to repeat itself,

and because it is a story of mutual reconciliation,
